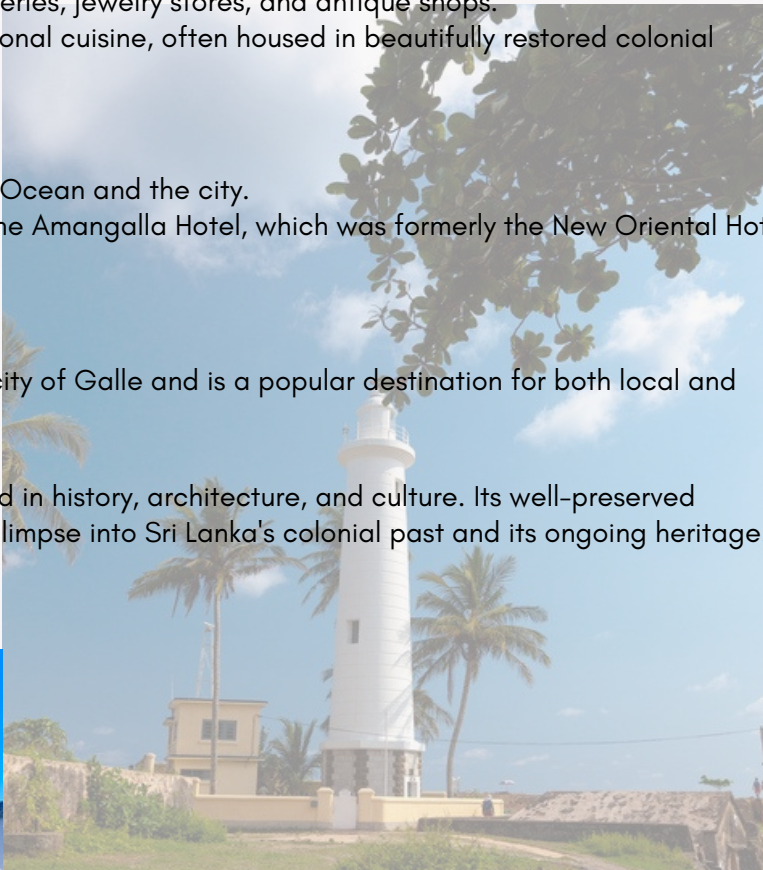

Safari Timing:

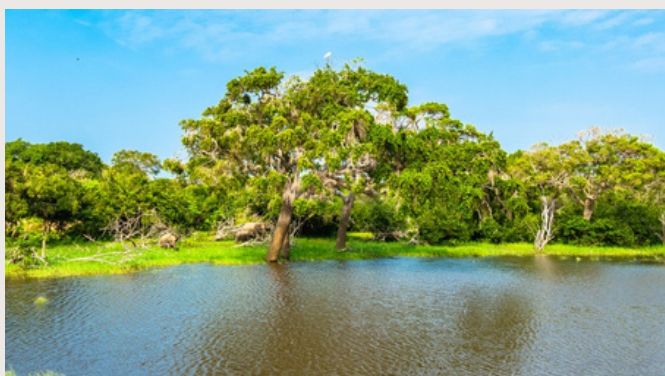
The afternoon safari typically starts around 2:30 PM and lasts until the park closes at 6:00 PM.

- The park is a haven for bird enthusiasts, with species such as the Sri Lankan junglefowl, painted storks, and eagles commonly seen.

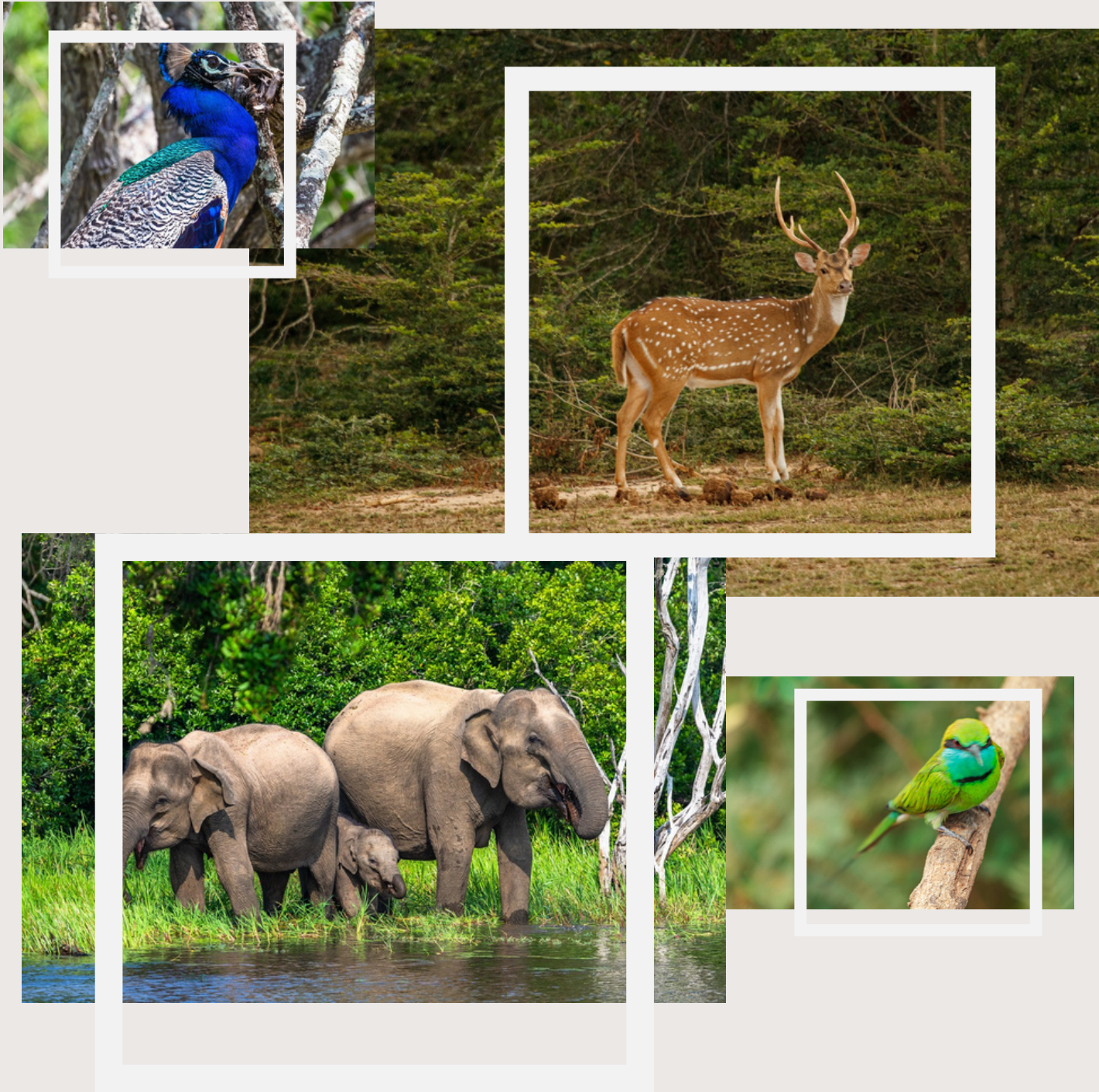

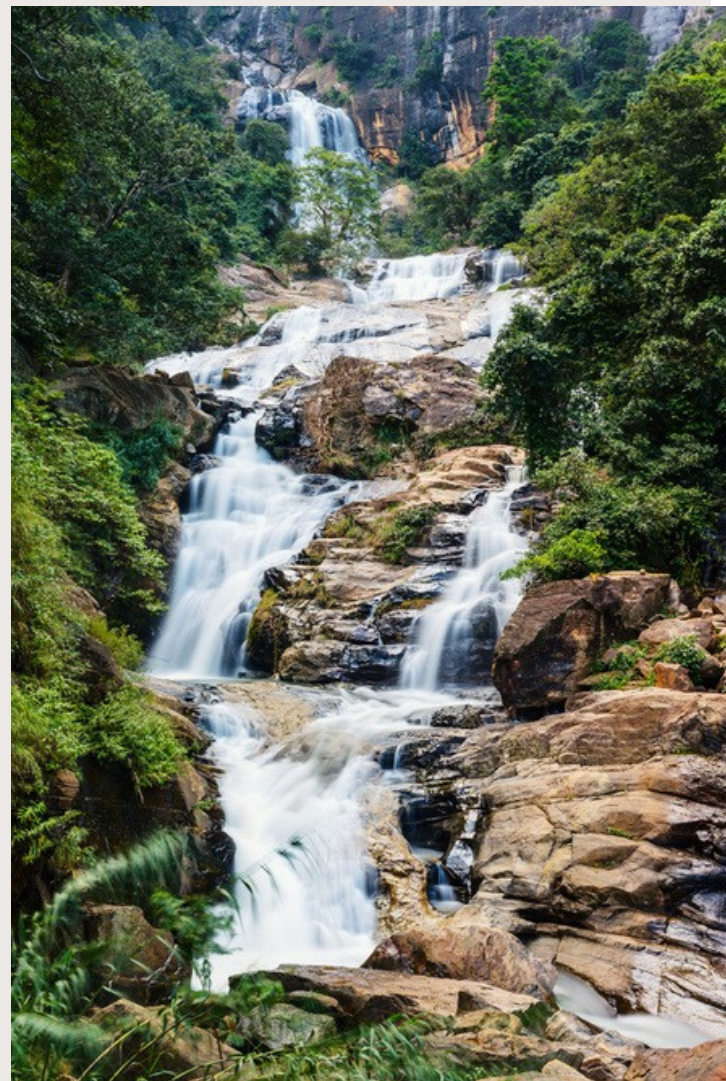
Nine Arches Bridge:

Architecture:

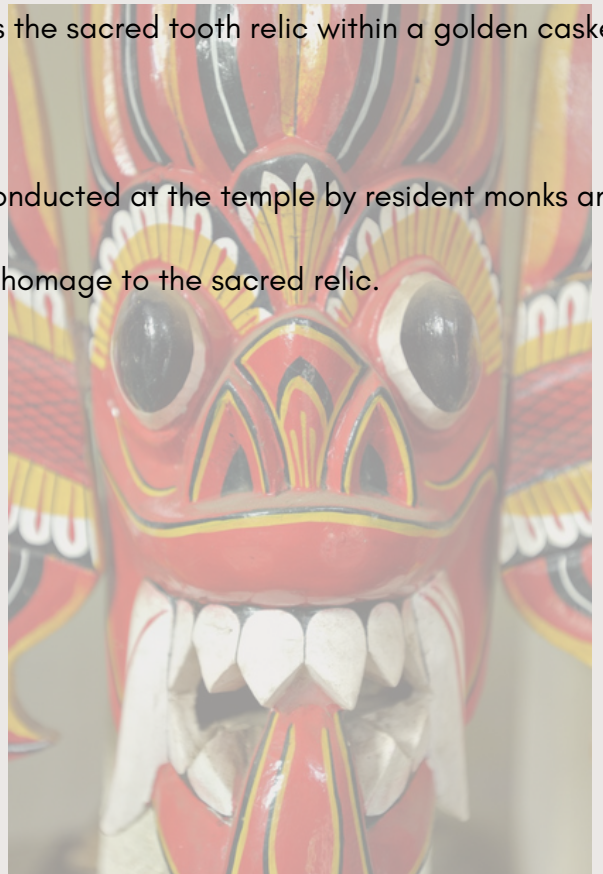
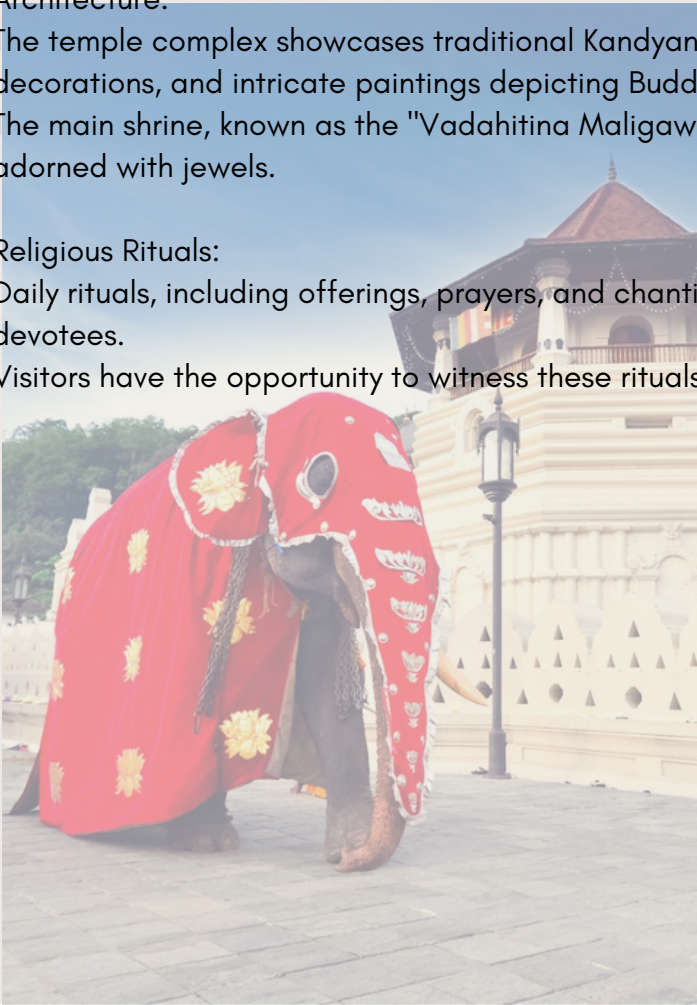
The temple complex showcases traditional Kandyan architecture, with ornate wood carvings, gilded decorations, and intricate paintings depicting Buddhist motifs.
